History:

This was first known as Syracuse Baptist Church. "To write the history of Syracuse Church, it becomes necessary also that we write the history of the old Beulah Church as they are identical. Elias George, a pioneer Baptist preacher, walked from his home, near to where Bunceton now is, and preached for the early settlers of this community, at a little school house about half a mile west of this town, south of the railroad, about 50 yards south of where Highway 50 crossed Otter creek, on land belong to Eliza Shanklin. This was in the early 1840s.

There on the 10 day of September 1842, old Beulah Baptist Church began to have its being as an organized body. Here is a record of Beulah Baptist Church. From 1842 for several years, it had 28 white members, and 8 colored members. The record of the church from was lost from 1842 – 1857. In 1857 they were worshipping in a neat new building near Otter Creek on Highway 12. Still may be seen a few scatters stones of a graveyard."
