Politicians with Links to Cooper County, Missouri

The following people were politicians with some type of link to Cooper County, Missouri. The information was taken from <u>The Political Graveyard</u> which I hope you will visit.

- Benedict, Henry Stanley (1878-1930) of Los Angeles, Calif. Born in Boonville, Mo., February 20, 1878. Member of California state assembly, 1910-14; U.S. Representative from California 10th District, 1916-17. Died in London, England, July 10, 1930. Interment at Forest Lawn Memorial Park, Glendale, Calif. (See also his congressional biography.)
- Ainslie, George (1838-1913) Born near Boonville, Mo., October 30, 1838. Member of Idaho territorial House of Representatives, 1865-66; Delegate to U.S. Congress from Idaho Territory, 1879-83; defeated, 1882. Died in Oakland, Calif., May 19, 1913. <u>Cremated</u>; ashes originally interred at <u>Odd Fellows Cemetery</u> (which no longer exists), San Francisco, Calif.; reinterment at <u>Greenlawn</u> <u>Memorial Park</u>, Colma, Calif. (See also his <u>congressional biography</u>.)
- Myers, Henry Lee (1862-1943) Born near Boonville, Mo., October 9, 1862. Member of Montana state senate, 1899-1903; district judge, 1907-11; U.S. Senator from Montana, 1911-23; justice of Montana state supreme court, 1927-29. Died in Billings, Mont., November 11, 1943. Interment at <u>Riverview</u> <u>Cemetery</u>, Hamilton, Mont. (See also his <u>congressional biography</u>.)
- Barton, David (1783-1837) Born near Greeneville, Tenn., December 14, 1783. Missouri territory attorney general, 1813; circuit judge, 1815; member of Missouri territorial House of Representatives, 1818; delegate to Missouri state constitutional convention, 1820; U.S. Senator from Missouri, 1821-31; member of Missouri state senate, 1834-35. Died in Boonville, Mo., September 28, 1837. Interment at Walnut Grove Cemetery, Boonville, Mo. Barton County, Mo. is named for him. (See also his congressional biography.)
- Ashley, William Henry (1778-1838) of St. Louis County, Mo. Born in Powhatan County, Va. Lieutenant Governor of Missouri, 1820-24; U.S. Representative from Missouri at-large, 1831-37. Died near Boonville, Mo., March 26, 1838. Interment in private or family graveyard. (See also his <u>congressional biography</u>.)
- Dorsey William Shackleford (1853-1936) Born in Missouri, <u>August 27</u>, <u>1853</u>.
 State court judge; <u>U.S. Representative from Missouri</u> 8th District, 1899-1919.
 Interment at Walnut Grove Cemetery. (See also his <u>congressional biography</u>.)
- John Cosgrove (1839-1925) Born in New York. <u>U.S. Representative from</u> <u>Missouri</u> 6th District, 1883-85. Interment at Walnut Grove Cemetery. (See also his <u>congressional biography</u>.)

- Vest, George Graham (1830-1904) Born in Frankfort, Ky., December 6, 1830. Member of Missouri state house of representatives, 1860; Delegate from Missouri to the Confederate Provisional Congress, 1861-62; Representative from Missouri in the Confederate Congress, 1862-65; Senator from Missouri in the Confederate Congress, 1865; U.S. Senator from Missouri, 1879-1903. Died in Sweet Springs, Mo., August 9, 1904. Interment at <u>Bellefontaine Cemetery</u>, St. Louis, Mo. (See also his <u>congressional biography</u>.)
- Benton, Thomas Hart (1782-1858) of St. Louis, Mo. Father-in-law of John <u>Charles Frémont</u>. Born near Hillsboro, N.C., March 14, 1782. Member of Tennessee state senate, 1809; U.S. Senator from Missouri, 1821-51; U.S. Representative from Missouri 1st District, 1853-55. Died in Washington, D.C., April 10, 1858. Interment at <u>Bellefontaine Cemetery</u>, St. Louis, Mo. Benton counties in <u>Ark.</u>, <u>Ind.</u>, <u>Iowa</u>, <u>Minn.</u>, <u>Ore.</u> and <u>Wash.</u> are named for him. (See also his <u>congressional biography</u>.)
- Stephens, Lawrence Vest 'Lon' (1858-1923) Born December 21, 1858. Missouri state treasurer, 1890-97; Governor of Missouri, 1897-1901. Died January 10, 1923. Burial location unknown.
- Nelson, William Lester (1875-1946) of Columbia, Mo. Born in Missouri. Member of Missouri state legislature; U.S. Representative from Missouri, 1919-21, 1925-33, 1935-43 (8th District 1919-21, 1925-33, 2nd District 1935-43). Interment at <u>Columbia Cemetery</u>, Columbia, Mo. (See also his <u>congressional</u> <u>biography</u>.)
- **Gmelich, Jacob Friedrich (d. 1914)** Missouri state treasurer, 1905-09. Died February 21, 1914. <u>Burial location unknown</u>.

• **Bingham, George Caleb** (1811-1879) Born in Augusta County, Va., March 20, 1811. Member of Missouri state legislature, 1848; Missouri state treasurer, 1862-65. Painter. Died in Kansas City, Mo., July 7, 1879. Interment at <u>Union Cemetery</u>, Kansas City, Mo.
