\$150 REWARD.**

RUNAWAY from the subscribers, residing near Fayette, Howard county, Mo., on Sunday, the 27th inst., two negro men; one named



ADDISON, aged about 20 years, near 6 feet high, complexion quite black, stout made and stutters, had on a black broad-cloth coat, striped pants, and black fur hat, and had with him a frock coat and pants of pale brown jeans. The other named FREDERICK, about 22 years old, light complexion, 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, slender made and straight, smiles when spoken to and stammers a little, bushy head; dress, black coat, pants, vest, fur hat, and boots, and took a cap and suit of brown jeans, frock coat.

The above reward will be paid if taken out of this State, and \$50 if taken out of this county and \$25 if taken in this county for both. We incline to the opinion that they will go towards the Mississippi and perhaps to Canada.

—ALSO—

There left at the same time, a negro man belonging to John R. White, named CHARLES, aged about 20 or 7 years, copper color, 5 feet 10 or 11 inches high; had on when he left a blue frock cloth coat, white pantaloons and silk hat. The same reward will be paid for him as the others. He was raised on the Mississippi river, in this State, and has once been to Canada.
