

—Mrs. Mercerean died very suddenly, at her home, in Blackwater, last Saturday evening. On that day she spoke of feeling unusually well, and that evening ate a very hearty supper. As she arose from the table, she exclaimed that she felt very dizzy, and her daughter saw her falling just in time to catch her in her arms. Before medical assistance could arrive, Mrs. Mercerean was dead. On Monday morning, the ladies of the order of Maccabees took charge of the remains, as Mrs. Mercerean was a member of Mystic Hive, No. 4, of Slater, Mo., her former home. The interment took place Monday, in the cemetery at Wesley Chapel, a short distance south of Pilot Grove, where relatives from Sedalia met the remains. Deceased had lived in Blackwater about three months. She was born in New York, educated in Pennsylvania, and removed to Missouri in 1867. She leaves two children, both grown—a son and a daughter; also many relatives and friends, who will miss an excellent neighbor and a noble woman.
