

DR. CHAS. F. MOORE

Dies at the Home of His Daughter in Poteau
Oklahoma.

Dr. Charles F. Moore, was born in Cooper County, Mo., May 6th, 1826, and died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. W. D. Buckley, in Poteau, Oklahoma, where he had gone to spend the winter, on Thursday December 16th. The remains were brought to Boonville on the late Katy Limited Saturday evening. The funeral services were held at the Baptist church Sunday morning at the noon hour, Rev. Sam P. Gott, of Liberty, preaching the discourse.

After the church services the body was taken in charge by the members of Cooper Lodge, No. 36, A. F. & A. M., and conducted to Walnut Grove Cemetery for interment.

Mr. Moore has resided in Cooper county practically all of his long and useful life, and for more than twenty years had been an honored citizen of Boonville.

He was married on July 26th, 1848 to Miss Martha English, of Moniteau county, Mo. To this union was born ten children, four of whom died in early life. His companion also died about two years ago. The living children are R. E. Moore, of this city, G. D. Moore, of Sedalia, Mrs. W. D. Buckley, of Poteau, Oklahoma, Mrs. R. L. Windsor, of Boonville, Mrs. W. M. Eller and G. H. Moore, of Speed. Besides these, deceased also leaves thirty-five grand children and four great grand children.

The deceased united with the Concord Baptist church when a young man, under the preaching of Dr. Tutt and all through his life was loyal to his early profession of faith to his master, and in his daily pursuits of life the same spirit of kindness and honesty was exemplified. He was upright and fair in all of his affairs with his fellow men, and had the love and respect of all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance.

In the death of Dr. Moore the community has lost a good and useful citizen, whose example will linger long after his departure. It is all well. Peace to his soul.
