OLD CITIZEN DIES

W. S. Potter Passes Away in the Seventy-seventh Year of His Age

W. S. Potter was born in Cooper County September 16, 1836; died at his home in this city March 20, 1913 at the advanced age of 76 years, 6 months, and 4 days. After funeral services at residence Saturday afternoon, the remains were interred at Walnut Grove cemetery.

Deceased is survived by the wife and four children, three sons and one daughter. He resided in the county of his birth his entire life with the exception of three years which he spent in Johnson County. His illness was of short duration. On the morning of the day of his death, he remarked he felt better than he had felt for some time, and in the afternoon told his wife he felt like eating something. A few hours thereafter he began to cough heavily and within a short time expired. The surviving wife of many years and the children have the sympathy of all their friends in their bereavement.
