BURIED IN PILOT GROVE

William M. White, 83 Years Old Died
Sunday Afternoon.

William M. White, 83 years old died Sunday afternoon at 5:30 o'clock at the home of his daughter, Mrs. J. D. Hudson, one and one half miles northwest of Smithton, death was due to general debility.

Mr. White was born near Boonville, February 8, 1836. He had been a farmer by occupation and had resided in Pettis County practically all of his life. He is survived by one son, Lon White, of St. Louis, and three daughters, Mrs. J. H. Shoemaker of Valda, Mo.; Mrs. R. A. Groch of Marlin City, Mo.; and Mrs. Hudson, all of whom were present at the death of their father.

The remains were shipped to Pilot Grove, Tuesday morning where funeral services were conducted by the Rev. G. H. Comman at the Methodist Church. Interment was in the Pilot Grove Cemetery.
