P. B. MADDOX KILLED BY A TRAIN SUNDAY

STRUCK WHEN WALKING ACROSS GRADE CROSSING AT . FACTORY — BROTHER OF CHIEF MADDOX.

Phillip Bradley Maddox, 70 years old, this city, was instantly killed Sunday when he was struck by a west-hound freight train on the International Shoe Company factory crossing. Death was caused by an injury to the head. The accident occurred shortly after 12 o'clock.

Mr. Maddox was struck when he approached the crossing and turned around after someone had called to him, it was said. The body was thrown clear of the track by the engine.

Mr. Måddöx is survived by three children; Forrest Maddox and Miss Carolita Maddox of Ottumwa, In., and Phillip Maddox of Forest City, Ark. Two brothers, Ed. M. Maddox chief of police of Marshall, and Fred M. Maddox of, Napton, and one sister, Mrs. Lavy Towers of St. Charles, also survive.
