

Falling Tree Kills Prairie Home Man

William Hertzberg Dies of
Fractured Skull Follow-
ing Accident

INJURY THOUGHT
NOT BAD AT FIRST

Was Native Cooper Coun-
tarian.—Funeral Held
Wednesday

William Hertzberg, 53 years old, Prairie Home, died Monday night a result of an injury to his head at afternoon caused by a falling tree. He was working in the strip timber east of here belonging to C. Kuhn, and was helping pull a tree by driving a team that's being used in the work. When the tree fell Mr. Hertzberg was catching the team and failed to get out of the path of the falling tree. At first he was apparently not badly hurt and continued his work. When it was noticed that all was not right with him and Mr. Kuhn brought him at once to the doctor. Mr. Hertzberg became unconscious before reaching the doctor's office and died at 9 o'clock without regaining consciousness. The tree was not a large one and seemingly was not falling heavily nor swiftly, but the force of the blow was sufficient to fracture the skull.

William, son of Fred and Sarah Meyer) Hertzberg, was born in Ireland, 1878, near Gooch Mill, and lived all of his life in Cooper county. He had been a member of the Baptist church since early manhood, retaining his membership several years ago from the Providence church to the one at Prairie Home. He was of a quiet, gentle, kindly disposition and was an honest citizen. He leaves two daughters, Margaret and Marie, of Sedalia; one son, Mrs. Katie Remison, of Prairie Home with whom he made his home and to whose support he contributed; four brothers, Henry, of Eldorado Springs; John, Carl and James, of Jerseyville, Ill., all of whom were present at the funeral, and a number of nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at the Prairie Home Baptist church with the services in charge of the pastor, Rev. W. W. Brown. Burial was in Pleasant Grove Evangelical cemetery beside his parents, who died many years
