Funeral services for J. M. Hurt, who died Tuesday at his residence at 701 Pendleton Avenue, were held at the home Thursday morning at 10:30 o'clock, conducted by the Rev. I. D. Borders of the Boonville Presbyterian Church. Burial was made in Walnut Grove cemetery.

James Marion Hurt was born April 10, 1853, in the Clark's Fork community, a son of William and Katherine Robinson Hurt. He spent all his life until twelve years ago farming, retiring and coming to Boonville with Mrs. Hurt, who preceded him in death last year.
