

**Mrs. Eliza Thomas,  
80 Years Old, Dies**

**Native Cooper-Countian Was Buried Friday Afternoon at Mt. Nebo**

Mrs. Eliza J. Steele Thomas died at her home in New Lebanon Wednesday, Jan. 13. Funeral services, pallbearers: Millard Stahl and Earl home with burial being made in the New Lebanon Cemetery. Services were in charge of the Rev. M. J. Berquist, pastor of the Mt. Nebo Baptist church. Thomas and Ira Thomas of the New Lebanon community. She also leaves four grandsons, Ferrel, Barnard, Marvin and Robert Lyle Thomas.

Mrs. Thomas had long been a member of the Baptist church and was well known and held in high regard by many friends and neighbors.
