Are Charged With Highway Robbery

Herbert and Willard Rowles and
Ernest Custer of Boonville
Held

Charges of highway robbery have been filed against Herbert and Willard Rowles, brothers, and Ernest Custer, all of Boonville, for the alleged robbery of William Kosfeldt, also of Boonville, within the city limits on No. 40.

Each made bond of \$3,000 yesterday and was released until a preliminary hearing to be held here before Judge Charles L. Vollrath on Saturday, April 9.

Kosfeldt charges that the three attacked him and robbed him of \$1. County officers have been working on the case since that time.
