Civil War Veteran Dies in 98th Year

William Elijah Tuttle passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Tom L. Neale at Clifton City, March 18, 1934

Mr. Tuttle was born in Canada in the year of 1836 and was 98 years old at the time of his death. He was married to Nancy Elizabeth Lewis Nov. 11, 1866 and to this union three children were born. Dicy Ellen, who died in infancy; William Ewing, who died in 1898 at the age of 27 years and Mrs. Caroline Ann Neale, wife of Tom L. Neale of Clifton City. His wife preceded him in death Jan 16, 1914. Mr. Tuttle has made his home with Mrs. Neale the past 8 years.

In addition to the one daughter who survives, he leaves nine grandchildren and twenty great-grandchildren.

The deceased united with the New Lebanon Presbyterian church about 1867 and his membership has always been with that church. He served almost the entire 4 years in the civil war.

Mr. Tuttle was discharged Aug. 28, 1865 at the close of the war.

Funeral services were held at the New Lebanon church Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, conducted by the Rev. Meyers. Pallbearers were Minor Neale, Slater, Mo.; Frank Neale and Ed Hall of Sedalia; Norville Cook and Wick Goode of Syracuse and R. W. Stewart of Clifton. Interment was made in New Lebanon cemetery.
