Sam Blackey, 76, Dies At Blackwater

Sam Blackey died at the home of his son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Steel, less than one mile north of town, Monday at 3:40 p. m., July 2. He had been confined to his bed three weeks but had not been well for several months. Mr. and Mrs. Steel motored to his home in Burden, Kans., the latter part of last January and brought him home with them. He had been a widower for a number of years. He would have been 77 next September. Was a member of the Baptist church. He has one son in Idaho.

His remains were sent by train leaving here on early morning train Wednesday, July 4. Mr. and Mrs. Steel and daughter, Miss Nina, left the same morning by motor. Mr. Blackey was buried at Salem cemetery near Burden, Kans.
