## Farmer Killed By Mo.Pac. Train

Prominent Nelson Resident Dies  
From Injuries Last Friday

Guy L. Smith a prominent farmer living about 2 miles north of Nelson met with a tragic death at 9:30 o'clock Friday morning when the local Mo. Pacific freight train struck the small truck he was driving across the tracks at the station in Nelson. Mr. Smith lived about 15 minutes but was not conscious after the accident. It is believed he did not hear or see the train until too late.

Mr. Smith was about 50 years of age and is survived by his widow, one daughter, Mrs. Ned Verts, and one son, Guy L., Jr., of the home. One brother, Ernest Smith of Muskogee, Okla., five sisters, Mrs. Joseph Barker and Mrs. Alex Bollott, of Marshall, Mrs. John Kerhart of Kansas City, Mrs. Trafton Jones and Mrs. Charles Havey of Nelson community. His mother, Mrs. Levy Smith was drowned in the Missouri River at Lexington 16 years ago. Funeral services were held at the home Monday afternoon, burial at Ridge Park cemetery at Marshall.
