

Mrs. Margaret Ida Smith Dies

Mrs. Margaret Ida Smith, 80, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. T. A. Nelson, 527 East High, Monday morning at 2:05, following a lengthy illness.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at the Bunceton Presbyterian church at 2:30 conducted by the Rev. Jonathan Holoman, pastor of the Warrensburg Presbyterian church. Burial was in the Bunceton Masonic cemetery.

Preceding the services at Bunceton, short rites were held at the Nelson home at 1 o'clock.

Mrs. Smith was born Dec. 13, 1860, the daughter of William L. and Mary Ann Ware Cordry in Cooper county on the old Cordry homestead. She lived her entire life in this community. When 11 years of age she became affiliated with the Bunceton Presbyterian church.
