## HIBBER C. STEPHENS FUNERAL SERVICE

Bunceton Resident Died at Home on Saturday – Rites Were Held at Parker Funeral Home Sun.

Funeral services for Hibber C. Stephens, who died at his home in Bunceton Saturday April 11, were held Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the Parker Funeral Home. The Rev. C. S. Young, pastor of the local Methodist Church, conducted the rites. Burial was in the Bunceton Masonic cemetery.

Pallbearers were: William Doran, Earl Ford, Julius Kopp, Herman Kopp, J. S. Daniel and Frank Harris.

Hibber Corum Stephens, son of Joseph Lawrence and Lydia Corum Stephens, was born near Bunceton Dec. 29, 1859. He was one of seven children. On Feb. 20, 1910, he was married to Miss Cora Palmberg, who preceded him in death July 25, 1929.

Mr. Stephens lived most of his life in Cooper County and for a number of years conducted a meat market in Bunceton. In early manhood, he became a member of the Presbyterian Church and continued in that faith through life.

He is survived by one brother, John A. Stephens of Bunceton, and six nephews and six nieces.
