Illness Fatal To Dailey Dave Pulley

NEW-LEBANON, Feb. 22—Daily

Dave Pulley, who had farmed in this area for the past 35 years, died at his home yesterday. He had been ill about two years.

Funeral services will be conducted at the New Lebanon Presbyterian Church by the Rev. W. Bryant Hall of Boonville at 2:30 p. m. tomorrow. Burial will be in the church cemetery, under the direction of Hays and Painter. Pallbearers will be Lester Stone, Hurt Stone, L. J. Kempf, Noel Colc, Leonard Long and Troy Neale. The body will be taken to

the church at 1:30 p. m. and remain there until time for the rites.

Mr. Pulley is survived by his widow, six children, Garnet, Marvin, George, Jessie and Kenneth, all of the home, and Miss Mary Pulley of Benton, Ark., and by one sister, Mrs. Fred Templeiro, Hood River, Ore.

He was born near Bell Air Nov. 24, 1879, the son of Devereaux and Mary Pulley and was married to Jennie Altermott in Sedalia, Dec. 30, 1915.

Ben Piatt Dies At Home Of Daughter
