

Sapp Funeral Held Thursday

Curtis Sapp, age 67, died at his farm home south of Boonville Monday at 9 p.m. The funeral service was held at the First Baptist church in Boonville Thursday at 2 p.m. with the Rev. H. J. Hood officiating. Burial was in the Walnut Grove cemetery.

Mr. Sapp was born in Cooper county April 3, 1892, the son of James R. and Alice Rennison Sapp. He was married to Margaret Frieling on April 6, 1924, at Lone Elm.
