Mrs. Ira Thomas Dies This Morning

BUNCETON—Mrs. Ira Thomas, 75, a long-time resident of the rural Bunceton community, died at 1:45 a.m. today at St. Joseph hospital in Boonville.

Mrs. Thomas was born Oct. 22, 1885, the daughter of the late Judge Robert F. Ferguson and Janie Porter Ferguson of Beaman, Mo. She was married to the late Ira Thomas on Feb. 22, 1912. They had two sons, Marshall, who died in infancy, and Robert Lyle of Bunceton, who survives.

Mrs. Thomas has been a member of the Mt. Nebo Baptist Church for the past 60 years.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Monday at the Mt. Nebo Baptist Church with burial in the Lebanon Cemetery. Services will

be in charge of the Hays and Painter Funeral Home of Pilot Grove. The body will lie in state at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Lyle Thomas, Sunday afternoon.

Others survivors include her daughter-in-law, Mrs. R. L. Thomas; four grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. C. E. Palmer of Sedalla; and one brother, William E. Ferguson of El Cajon, Calif. Three brothers and one sister also preceded her in death.
