Services Sunday For Dr. J. A. Haley

Funeral services for Dr. Jack A. Haley, who died early Wednesday morning at Prairie Village, Kans., will be held at the Goodman and Boller chapel in Boonville Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock, with the Rev. Warner L. Miles of Kansas City officiating. Burial will be in the Walnut Grove cemetery.

Friends may call at the Goodman and Boller Funeral Home from Friday evening until time of the services.

Dr. Haley was born in St. Louis August 25, 1921, the son of the late James Haley and Mrs. C. J. Mesger of Sullivan, Mo. He was graduated from the Boonville High school with the class of 1939, from the University of Missouri in 1949, and from Washington University at St. Louis in 1951.

On May 7, 1944, he was married in Boonville to Miss Doris Virginia Smith, who survives with four children, Dianne L. Haley, 18, Janet, 17, Lance, 7, and Bruce, 5, all of the home. Also surviving are six brothers, the Rev. Marvin Haley of Marionville, Mo., Bernard L. Haley of Kansas City, Wendell E. Haley of Littleton, Colo., Donald Lee Haley of Temple Terrace, Fla., Wm. J. Haley of Orange, Calif., and Ted M. Haley of Columbia; Three sisters, Mrs. Bettie Schwartz of Grandview, Mo., Mrs. Gwendor Weatherman of Kansas City and Mrs. Beverly Alley of Kansas City.

Dr. Haley served as a Marine in the South Pacific in World War I. He was a member of the Baptist church.
