Robert W. Moore Killed in Action

SPEED -- Pfc. Robert W. Moore, U.S. Army, was killed in a mine explosion on Friday in Vietnam. His wife and parents were notified about 3:30 p.m. yesterday of the death, in combat.

Pfc. Moore went to Vietnam on Oct. 23, 1966. He entered service on April 27, and trained at Ft. Leonard Wood and at Ft. Polk, La.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Linda Sue Stayton Moore, of Route 3, Boonville; his parents; Mr. and Mrs. Howard Moore of Speed; one sister, Mrs. Maurice Amtck, of Boonville; one brother, Howard P. Moore, of Speed; five aunts, Mrs. Dennis Williams of Speed, Mrs. Henry Baumann of Eugene, Mrs. Henry Penniston of Independence and Mrs. William Ostrander and Mrs. Alex Evanoff, both of Kansas City; four uncles, Rimey Cary of Billingsville, Earl C. Cary of Speed, Bill Cary of Pilot Grove and Eugene Cary of Kansas City; and four nieces and nephews.

Pfc. Moore was born April 4, 1947, at Speed, and graduated from the Bunceton High School in 1965. He worked for the

Mid-Missouri Telephone Co. until he entered service. He and Mrs. Moore were married Sept. 24, 1966.

Additional details concerning the mine explosion have not been received by Mrs. Moore or the victim's parents as yet. Major George Guy delivered the message yesterday.
