## Vietnam War Victim Services Saturday

Funeral services for Pfc. Robert Moore, killed in action in Vietnam Friday, will be held at 2:30 p.m. Saturday at the Bunceton Baptist Church, with the Rev. Robert Streeter officiating. Burial will be in the Bunceton Masonic Cemetery with military services at the graveside by a color guard from Ft. Leonard Wood.

Friends may call at the B.W. Thacher Funeral Home from Friday morning until noon Saturday and from then at the church.

Pfc. Moore had been in Vietnam with the U.S. Army since Oct. 23, 1966, and his death was the result of a mine explosion.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Moore of Speed, he was born at Speed April 4, 1947. On Sept. 24, 1966, he was married to the former Miss Linda Stayton, Route 3, Boonville, who also survives.

He was a graduate of Bunceton High School and had been employed by Mid-Missouri Telephone Co. before entering service.

Other survivors are one sister, Mrs. Maurice Amick, of Boonville; one brother, Howard P.
