Cpl. Stone Sees Vietnam Action

DA NANG, Vietnam--Marine Lance Corporal Carl H. Stone, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles H. Stone of Pilot Grove, Mo., took part in fighting just south of Da Nang, Vietnam, as part of "Operation Union II", while serving with the Second Battalion, Fifth Marine Regiment, First Marine Division.

The operation is considered by Marines as one of the largest and most successful military operations in Vietnam. During the 11-day sweep through the area, the Leathernecks accounted for more than 600 of the enemy killed, with 400 of that figure being killed in just two days of fighting.

While in Vietnam, his regiment forms the ground element of the Marine Corps air-ground team, and conducts large-scale search and destroy operations against the enemy in South Vietnam.
