Anna Miller, 95, Is Taken by Death

One of Monroe's oldest residents, Mrs. Anna Miller, 95, of 1503 19th St., died at 12:30 a.m. Wednesday, March 20, in White Haven Nursing Home, Old Argyle Road.

Until last November she had continued to live in her home at 1503 19th Street where she came as a bride in 1896. At that time the house was on the outskirts of town. For many years, Mrs. Miller was custodian of Lincoln Park and that included the years when the park was a tourist-camping site. Mrs. Miller's work there was most convenient since she lived just across the street from the park.

Mrs. Miller had been a seamstress and also a practical nurse, working both in her home and in individual homes.

She was the former Anna Rote, born in Clarno Township, Aug. 20, 1872, a daughter of Paul and Elizabeth Rote. She was married to Fred W. Miller.

Mrs. Miller was a member of the First Methodist Church of Monroe.

She is the last of her family. Nieces and nephews are the closest of her relatives.

Her daughter and only child, Florence Marie Miller Harris, died Feb. 9, 1932. Another shock to her was the death of her son-in-law, Frank Harris, on Oct. 4, 1964 since he had continued to look after Mrs. Miller after the death of his wife.
