Joint Rites For Man, Step-Son Who Drowned

Joint funeral services for Sgt. Joe E. Rennison, 24, and his 10-year old step-son, Joey Tiscale, who drowned while on a fishing trip Sunday, will be held at 1 p. m. Saturday in the Greshham Church near Van Buren. Burial will be in the Gresham Cemetery.

The two drowned while on a fishing trip about 4 p. m. Sunday on a lake near Fort Campbell, Ky. The wind came up and water got in the boat. A Great Dane dog was forced out of the boat and when he tried to get back in, the boat capsized.

Rennison's brother, Larry of Peplar Bluff, swam for the bank and when he looked back, Rennison and his step-son had disappeared. He swam back and tried to get Joe out, but it was too late.

Joe's wife, Pat, pulled Larry out and she then went for help. Renhison, born April 19, 1947. Attended school in Poplar Bluff. In 1967, he married Pat Tisdale, who survives.
