Vietnamese and 8,000 Cambodian soldiers launched the two-ended drive Wednesday to reopen Highway 4, which has been closed by North Vietnamese troops since Nov. 21. Phnom Penh has been cut off from its seaport, Kompong Som, creating shortages of oil, gas and other imports in the capital.

The U.S. plane shot down in Cambodia was an Army spotter craft that crashed in Kratie Province, in the northeastern part of the country. The crewmen were rescued.

Sources said the plane apparently was on a reconnaissance mission spotting North Vietnamese positions for U.S. artillery on the South Vietnamese side of the border.

It was the first American aircraft reported lost in Cambodia.
