JOHN BOTTOMS

Funeral services for John D. Bottoms, 65, of Pine Bluff, Arkansas, a retired employee of the Pine Bluff Arsenal who died Thursday at Jefferson Regional Medical Center, were Saturday at Trinity Lutheran Church, with the Rev. David Bahn officiating. Burial was in Graceland Cemetery by Ralph Robinson and Son Mortuary.

Born July 28, 1922, in Prairie Home, Missouri, he was a son of Liver Franklin and Hattie B. Adair Bottoms.

He was reared and educated at Prairie Home.

Mr. Bottoms served in the Civilian Conservation Corps as a young man and served in the Army during World War II.

After his tour of duty, he returned to the Arsenal, where he worked in the depot department until his retirement in 1971.

He was a member of Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4455 and the National Association of Retired Federal Employees.

Bottoms was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church, where he served as a trustee.

Survivors include his wife, the former Vioal McCain, whom he married April 18, 1947, in Pine Bluff; a son, David Carey Bottoms of Boonville, Missouri; six brothers, Hayden Bottoms of Prairie Home, Lewis Bottoms of Waynesville, Missouri, William Bottoms of Billings, Montana, Oliver Bottoms, of Chamois, Missouri, Harry Bottoms of Philadelphia and Don Bottoms of Leavenworth, Kansas; two sisters, Frances Smothers and Wanda Agnew of New Franklin, Missouri; and three grandchildren.
