Lewis C. Bottom, 72

Lewis Carey Bottom, 72, of Waynesville, died Friday, August 28, 1992 at the General Leonard Wood Army Community Hospital in Fort Leonard Wood, Mo. Funeral services were held at 10 a.m. Tuesday at the Waynesville Memorial Chapel with the Chaplain Daniel Musgrave officiating. Burial with military honors was in the Resurrection Cemetery in St. Robert, Missouri with Chaplain Musgrave and Father Brendan Lawless officiating. Services were under the direction of the Waynesville Memorial Chapel.

Lewis Carey Bottom was born February 1, 1920 in Prairie Home, the son of Oliver Bottom and Hattie Belle Adair Bottom. He entered the U.S. Army in 1941 and served in the European operations of World War II and later in the Korean War. On July 22, 1949 in Stuttgart, Germany, he married Katharina "Lilly" E. Keilmann. Master Sergeant Bottom retired from the military in 1965 and continued his career at the civil servant in the position of motor vehicle operator foreman at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. He retired from civil service in 1983.

Surviving in addition to his wife is one son, Dr. Carey Bernard Bottom of Whitehouse Station, New Jersey, three grandsons, four brothers, Hayden Bottom of Prairie Home, Don Bottom of Leavenworth, Kansas, Billy Bottom of Billings, Montana, and Truman Bottom of Marlton, New Jersey, and two sisters, Frances Smothers and Wanda Agnew, both of New Franklin. He was preceded in death by his parents, three brothers, Dorsey Bottom, John Bottom and Oliver Bottom, Jr., and four sisters, Gertrude Fain, Marshie Bottom, Betty Matthews and Judy Burks.
