He was president of the Red Cross of Mississippi County and served on many other committees. He was a member of the Osceola Kiwanis Club and was named Man of the Year in 1968. He was a deacon and trustee of the First Baptist Church in Osceola and taught Sunday School for many years. On January 24, 1979, a Jim Farris Day was proclaimed by the city of Osceola.
