He was a member of the Bunceton Baptist Church, Bunceton Chamber of Commerce, past member of the American Legion, a member of the Bunceton Rural Fire Department for 40 years, and Bunceton City Marshall for 16 years. He was employed at Toastmaster in the Tool and Die Department until his retirement. He was a veteran of the Korean Conflict and served in the United States Army.
