RENISON, Frederick Walter -- Born in Toronto, March 26, 1908, died at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Center on March 1, 2000 in his 92nd year. Son of the late Walter & Gertrude Harriet (Tong) Renison. Survived by brother William Edward Renison.

Christened at the Little Trinity Anglican Church, Toronto and attended Earl Kitchener Public School (Pape & Mortimer). On his sixteenth birthday, Fred left school to start working at the George Bilton Furniture Company, learning the furniture finishing trade. He retired after 42 years at the Robert Simpson Company later known as The Bay Company. He had a lifetime interest in gardening, putting in his first garden at the age of nine under the direction of his father. Fred's other interests included observing the beauty of nature, especially birds and wildflowers, crystal and tube radio making sets in the twenties, and photography, including developing and printing his own photographs. He was a Mason of Dufferin Lodge (570) and a 32nd degree of the Scottish Rite and a member of Leaside Presbyterian Church.
