




SENIOR HISTORY

In 1942 fourteen trembling green freshmen enrolled for their first year in Stewartsville High. They were as follows: Ardra Cornelius, Gladise Hamilton, Mary Alice Snow, Doris Winger, Marion Waller, Carl Johnson, Charles Brockman, Norman Keller, Roland Francis, Robert Boyer, Harold Divelbiss, Dale Sprague, Sidney Welch, and Lucile Martin. The annual freshman initiation welcomed us. Officers elected were: Lucile Martin, president; Gladise Hamilton, vice-president; Doris Winger, secretary-treasurer. Mrs. Kruse was our sponsor until she had to leave school because of poor health. After she left Miss Penny became our sponsor. At the school carnival Gladise Hamilton was the queen of the class and Charles Brockman was her escort. In the second semester Johnny Vanfossan, from Plattsburg, and Darrel McCrary, from Weatherby, joined the class.

On August 31, 1943, sixteen sophomores enrolled. During the year Loyde Eaton joined us from the Maysville School. The officers for the year were: Sidney Welch, president; Johnny Vanfossan, vice-president; Marion Waller, secretary-treasurer. We elected Mr. Young as our sponsor. That year Doris Winger was queen of our class and Norman Keller was her escort.

In 1944 seventeen juniors enrolled. We lost Darrel McCrary. Elton Mayse Jr. joined us from Plattsburg. The officers were: president, Sidney Welch; vice-president, Roland Francis; secretary-treasurer, Harold Divelbiss. Our sponsor was Mr. VanHorn. Again Gladise Hamilton was class queen and Norman Keller her escort. During the last part of the year Dale Sprague left and Elton Mayse joined the Navy but continued as a member of our class.

On September 3, 1945, fifteen seniors enrolled for their last year; Elton Mayse, a member of the graduating class, is still serving in the Seabees. Doris Winger Mayse enrolled in the Plattsburg School for her last year. Johnny Vanfossan moved from our community to Burlington Junction leaving only thirteen. The officers for the class were: president, Sidney Welch; vice-president, Roland Francis; secretary-treasurer, Charles Brockman. For three years Sidney Welch has been our president, a very good record. The queen of the class was Lucile Martin with Carl Johnson as her escort. On September 13 we enjoyed a party at the Roller Rythm. On December 13 a class party was held at Miss DeVall's. At this time the seniors are looking forward to the Junior-Senior Banquet, the Sophomore-Senior Breakfast, and Senior Day. During the last semester Loyde Eaton moved from our community to Osborn and Johnny Vanfossan joined our class again from Burlington Junction where he had been attending.

On August 30, 1943, twenty two freshmen enrolled in Stewartsville High School. They were: Robert Baker, Ila Mae Bauer, Wilbur Berryman, Maxine Binstead, Dale Bower, Maxine Coble, Lila Pearl Crum, Betty Lou Curl, Marjorie Fowler, Robert DeVall, John Fitzgerald, Charlotte Hayter, Darrell Kerns, Charles Killgore, Dixie Lee McIntosh, Daryl Ratcliff, Donna Faye Saunders, Richard Saunders, Leatrice Slabaugh, and Billy Word. Class officers were: president, Sue Mary Eames; vice-president, Robert DeVall; secretary-treasurer, Maxine Binstead. Our sponsor was Mrs. VanHorn. Before the year was over Billy Word moved away; but two members, Dorothy Stagner and Harold Eaton, added their names to the class roll. For the Carnival, they selected Ila Mae Bauer as the queen and Daryl Ratcliff as her escort.

In 1944, Iva Gene Kessler enrolled in the sophomore class, but they were sorry that Richard Saunders, June and Russel Carson, Wilbur Berryman, and Maxine Coble left. The main event of the year was the sophomore and senior breakfast, given in the sponsor's home, the morning of May 8, V-E Day. While at the tables they listened to the President's message. Class officers were: president, Sue Mary Eames; vice-president, Daryl Ratcliff; secretary-treasurer, Maxine Binstead; and their sponsor was Mrs. VanHorn. For the Carnival they selected Maxine Binstead as their queen and Charles Killgore as her escort.

In 1945, one new member, Joan Windsor of DeKalb, enrolled in the junior class. Class officers were: president, Charles Killgore; vice-president, Helen Sprague; secretary-treasurer, Joan Windsor; sponsor, Mr. VanHorn. An old fashioned garden was the theme of the banquet. This was the first year the banquet had been attended by the girls in formals. The class had one party. In 1945, two new members enrolled in the sophomore class. They were: Dorothy Yahnig of Palmyra and Milton Richardson of Osborn. George Karr, Milton Richardson and Betty Eaton left before the year was over. Class officers were: president, Warren G. Haman, vice-president, Dorothy Yahnig; secretary-treasurer, Virgil Kanan; sponsor, Mrs. VanHorn. The sophomore class entertain the freshmen with a party, October 2 at Mrs. VanHorn's. For the Carnival, they selected Dorothy Yahnig as their queen and Virgil Kanan as her escort.

Charles Ytell from Osborn joined the class for the last quarter. The big event of the year was the high school carnival. The freshman class won. The queen was Helen Killgore and her escort was Dean Johnson. The freshman class had a party January 25. They went to the Ritz at Cameron for the show "Hang Over Square".




