Death notices abstracted from newspapers can be a valuable source of information to the genealogist and, even if little information is printed, can establish that a certain family resided in the county during that particular time period.

Death notices were taken from several different newspapers located in the town of Charleston for the years 1858-1899 and it can be assumed that if no town or locality was listed in the notice that the person lived in or near Charleston.

Obituaries were scarce during certain periods of time. During the war years most papers carried only items pertaining to the war. At one time, the papers had a policy of charging a modest fee for publishing such notices. Evidently, many families either couldn't afford the price or wouldn't bother with furnishing the necessary information.

Spelling was, at times, atrocious and dates were often carelessly misprinted. In no instance did I correct the spelling of names, localities, or cause of death, nor did I correct the date of death. I cannot presume to know every family that lived in Mississippi County during the last half of the 19th century so all variations should be checked.

Mississippi County is located at the junction of the Mississippi and Ohio Rivers and is bordered by the states of Illinois and Kentucky, and in Missouri, by the counties of Scott and New Madrid. Death notices were included in Mississippi County newspapers for persons residing in these areas.

Many residents of Cairo who died were ferried across the river to Bird's Point and placed upon the train where the bodies were escorted to Charleston for burial at either of the two public cemeteries there. Included is a list of the 1878 yellow fever deaths which occurred in Cairo and the fatalities of the sinking of the "Katharin" by a cyclone at the confluence of the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers in 1896.

Included is a list of the 10th yellow fever deaths which occurred in Cairo and the localities of the sinking of the "Katie" by a cyclone at the confluence of the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers in 1875.
