According to an official message from the war department received Monday by Mr. and Mrs. Eddie Roberts, Calif.

Upon the completion of his basic training in October, he was home on a ten day delay enroute to Ft. Meade, Md., where he was only stationed a short time.

On November 5 he left Ft. Meade in Jack Potter, 21, rifleman in the glider infantry, was killed in action in Belgium January 5.

Pfc. Potter has been overseas since May of 1944. After going overseas he landed in Holland September 25, where he participated in two months of action for which he was awarded the combat infantry medal.
