**PFC. LEO PRESTON KILLED IN ACTION IN GERMANY**

An official message from the war department has been received by Mr. and Mrs. Willard Preston of near Philadelphia, telling them that their only son, Pfc. Leo V. Preston, 20, was killed in action somewhere in Germany March 4.

Pfc. Preston has been serving with the infantry since March 13, 1944, having been inducted from Shelby county and received basic training at Camp Fannin, Texas. He left the states for overseas duty September 7, 1944 and was serving with Gen. Patton's 3rd Army at the time of his death.

Pfc. Preston had been awarded the Silver Star Medal and the Combat Infantryman's Badge.

He was the second of 15 boys in the 1943 graduating class of Bethel high school to be killed.

**L. C. HENDERSON DIES MONDAY**

**Prominent Mo. Citizen Was Produce Co. Mgr.**

Louis Claud Henderson, 64, manager of the Henderson Produce Co., and a prominent business man in this section of Missouri, passed away at 1:10 o'clock Monday morning at his home in Monroe City after having been taken ill at midnight.

Mr. Henderson was born June 25, 1880, the son of Jasper and Annie Morehead Henderson near Strother in Monroe county. In 1898 the family moved to Monroe City and founded the Henderson Produce Co. Expansion of this plant began in 1906 when the late Jasper Henderson purchased from the Shelby Produce Co., the brick building that is now the nucleus of the company's large plants.

The firm became known in 1908 as the J. Henderson & Son, with L. C. Henderson entering into partnership with his father. For the past 35 years Mr. Henderson served as manager and part owner of the plant in 11 branch offices.

Under his management the company and employees have been awarded the army-navy "E" flag with two stars.

Mr. Henderson served as mayor of Monroe City from 1920 to 1924 and was president of the National Poultry, Butter and Edd Association. At the time of his death he was a member of the executive committee of the Institute of American Poultry Industries and of the Lions club in Monroe City.

On October 14, 1908 he was united in marriage to Miss Elizabeth Arnold at the First Baptist church in Monroe City. Surviving besides Mrs. Henderson is an only daughter, Mrs. Mark Twain Swearingen of Monroe City and two grandchildren, Betty Louis and Mark Arnold Swearingen. Two sisters, Mrs. C. P. Forsythe and Mrs. Roy B. Meriwether, both of Monroe City survive also. A brother, J. R. Henderson, Jr., preceded him in death.

Mr. Henderson was a member of the Christian church.

Funeral rites were held at 3:00 o'clock this afternoon from the Christian church with Rev. Edgar L. Knight of Oskaloosa, Iowa, officiating. Burial was in the St. Jude's cemetery at Monroe City.
