It was good to visit with you during our vacation and I do appreciate the opportunity of adding a line or two about Lentner School, a place very close to my heart. It was my happy privilege to spend fifteen years at that school--eight years as a student and seven years as a teacher.

In September 1932, just a few days after the Lentner Bank closed its doors, I began teaching at Lentner.

Space does not permit me to recount many incidents, but I do recall our annual pie suppers which helped us purchase some of the extra teaching aids and playground equipment. One year we took on a major project of installing electric lights in the school. Another event was when the entire school went to J. S. Rogers farm and observed a corn husking contest, and I recall that your father provided one of the cars for transportation.

As I read the weekly papers, it gives me a sense of pride to see how well many of my former pupils are now doing and I congratulate you on your achievements in business and professional circles.

Four of the shade trees which are north of the walk were planted in 1938, and each time I see them it brings back fond memories.

Although Lentner was just a one room school, it played an important role in the education of hundreds of boys and girls. Should you have additional questions, I shall be most happy to hear from you.
