Aug 10, 1881-C. W. Adams daughter died, live south of Clarence, granddaughter of Hiram Collins.

Aug 17, 1881-Cassie V. Adams, daughter of C.W. & Bettie died, 1 year and 7 days old.

Mar 5, 1879-Charles Adams & Bettie Collins were married last Wednesday evening at the residence of the bride's father, near town.

May 7, 1884-Hays Adams, son of Thornton Adams, died Apr 30, 1884 at father's home, 6 miles southeast of Shelbina, age 31, been married 2 months.

Apr 15, 1874-James Adams, 80th year, of Monroe county, member of Presbyterian Church, Shelbina, died 11 Apr 1874. From Ky to Monroe county in 1864. A Presbyterian for 50 years.

Dec __, 1880-On 16th instant, at residence of bride's father, Thornton Adams, by Elder W. B. Craig, Isaac W. Caldwell & Miss Sarah M. Adams, all of Monroe county.

Dec. __, 1880-Robert Adams, son of Judge Adams, made a fortunate escape from a serious accident Monday. He was on top of a load of straw, sitting well forward, holding the reins; while crossing the rail road track west of town, the jolting caused him to slip or pitch forward, and falling on the back of the off mule, then backwards over the animal to the ground, he was dragged some distance, his feet having become entangled in the lines.

Mar __, 1875-William F. Alexander & Miss Ann Eliza Hawkins were married at residence of Bowles Hawkins, by W. W. McMurry on Mar 4, 1875.

Apr 7, 1875-Alex M. Anderson & Miss Elizabeth Barker were married at Christian Church in this place, 6 Apr 1875, by Elder W. G. Surber.

Aug 28, 1889-Miss Eva Barker, daughter of Mrs. Cora Barker died at _____ Arthur S. Larrick, Maud, Mo., age 19.

Oct 8, 1879-Mrs. A. Bell died in Shelbina, Thursday, October 2, 1879, at residence of William Swartz, age 64 years, 7 months.

Jul 4, 1888-Beshears children drowned, 3 & 7 years of age, of William Beshears and wife, one child left. Buried Mt. Sterling, Ralls county.

Mar 6, 1889-Mr. & Mrs. John J. Bragg's 2 day old babe died on Sunday.

Jan 19, 1881-Ann S. Broughton (W. C.) died at her son-in-law's, William H. Sanders, daughter of Judge Kendrick of Ralls county, Mo. Born 25 May 1825, age 56. Left one daughter & 5 sons.

Sep 3, 1879-James K. Broughton, of the Hardware firm of Broughton Bros., Odessa, Mo., arrived last week and will remain until after the fair.

Feb 26, 1879-Robert Broughton, in a week or two, will go with his family to Odessa, Lafayette county, near Kansas City, where he will locate and commence business with a stock of hardware.

Sep 17, 1879-Mrs. Robert Broughton, of Odessa, Mo., is in town visiting friends.

Jan 1, 1873-Lodge Tribute to Daniel C. Byrd. (Died 1872).

___ __, 1876-William Cadwell married Miss Elizabeth Quigley, all of Shelby county at bride's father residence, by Rev. W.W. McMurray.

Jun 2, 1870-Mrs. Kate Caldwell, born 7 Mar 1845 in Ohio county, Indiana; died 15 May 1870 at resident of brother-in-law, James S. Pemberton, 26 years old. Wife of Samuel D. Caldwell, they were married 20 Sep 1864, survived by 2 children, with parents to Marion county in 1857.

Mar 1, 1882-R. C. Calvert died Feb 27, at 7:30 at home in Shelbyville, Mo., b. 22 Nov 1833 in Rappahannock, Va, 49 years, to Mo. in 1857. In Civil War, left wife.

✓ Sep 26, 1883-Miss Fannie Carnahan, sister of John Carnahan died in Quincy, IL.

✓ May 21, 1879-A loose seat tipping precipitated John Carnahan and wife backwards out of a spring wagon, Sunday, near the west railroad crossing. Mrs. Carnahan's shoulder was broken.

May 14, 1879-A. Chinn & Minter Veal expect to 'go west' this week, with Leadville on their banners.

Jan 31, 1877-Florie Colvert, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James A. Colvert of Brownsville, Mo. died, age 17 months.

Nov __, 1880-It was rumored on the streets Monday, that William Conboy and Miss Blackford were secretly married Sunday evening. It seems the young lady's parents were opposed to the match, and had forbidden young Conboy to visit the girl; but "love laughs at locksmiths," proved no exception in this case. The next thing in order is for the parents to forgive the young couple and bestow their blessings. The Democrat wishes the young couple joy.

Jan 10, 1872-William B. Cotton, resident of this place died, a husband and father.

Feb 9, 1876-Mrs. Jane Curtis, died 05 Feb 1876 at residence of E. D. Hoselton in Shelbina, age 42 years 4 months. TB.

Oct 16, 1872-Returned. A. E. Daugherty & John Quigley arrived here first part of the week from Texas. Some two months since Mr. Daugherty disposed of his property here and went to Texas, taking his family, hoping the change would prove beneficial to his invalid wife. Every attention was shown her on the way out to the pampas; she grew perceptibly worse near the close of the journey and on reaching Red River expired. Her disease was consumption.

Sep 5, 1877-James Dehner died at 3:00 Sunday morning, lived north of the Shelbyville road, aged 39 years, 5 months, 13 days, leaves 5 children, wife died last July.

Dec 8, 1870-Phantleroy Dye, died 28 Nov 1870, in 76th year, born Mercer county, Ky. To Missouri 1823, residence of Monroe & Shelby counties, Mo. Had been married twice, married consort of Jesse White not quite a year ago. Professed Christian religion, (Fauntleroy Dye).

Aug 22, 1888-Mrs. R. T. Fitzpatrick died Sunday at family residence 4 miles south of town, 33 years old.

May 9, 1888- Mrs. Nancy Frye, old resident of Marion county, Mo. died on Friday at residence of daughter, Mrs. John Givan 2 miles south of Lakenan, 90 years.

Mar 4, 1874-Mrs. Susan Fuqua, wife of Dr. C. C. Fuqua died of pneumonia at residence near Hannibal, brought to Shelbina Saturday night. Buried Crooked Creek Sunday, services by Rev. Busby.

Mar 31, 1875-David Givin died 25 Mar 1875 at son-in-law's residence, 3 miles west of Shelbina, 72 years, 1 month & 12 days. Formerly from Highland county, Va. Member Methodist church. Survived by large family.

Mar 26, 1884-Delia Gough, 11 year old daughter of James A. & Mary T. Gough, southeast of Shelbina, went to school at Clarence. Lived with aunt, Mrs. P. W. Hanigan, died Mar 23. Delia was a grandchild of James Gough.

Jan 14, 1885-George Gough, born in Kentucky, died 10 Jan 1885, Monroe county, buried at Clinton. To Mo. in 1836, settled between Clinton and where Lakenan is now, leaves wife & 10 children.

Feb 8, 1882-Katie L. Gough, only daughter of James L. & Winifred Gough, died in Chillicothe, buried Catholic cemetery.

May 2, 1877-Mrs. James Green of Shelbina, age 34, died Apr 25, 1877.

Apr 21, 1870-Stephen Theodore Green well, son of George W. & Sarah Greenwell died.

Feb 2, 1881-Mr. Griggs child, age 16, died.

May 19, 1870-Harvey Parsons Grout, son of H. & E. Grout died.

Jun 13, 1883- Has obit for J. A. Hamilton's little child, age 1 year, 10 months, 7 days.

Feb 15, 1882-James Hamilton's wife died of pneumonia, in Jackson township.

Feb 12, 1873-William Harding died at his residence, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles northeast of Shelbina, of pneumonia on Saturday, Feb 8th.

Jul 16, 1879-Will be a basket dinner near Hardy's School House 8 miles east of Shelbina, July 26, 1879. Managers: William Harris, J. Williams & L. Utz.

Feb 12, 1879-Walkersville Items. Fannie Carnahan was alto in Henniger Concert troupe.

Sep 19, 1877-Lucy Hoffman, daughter of Elias Bragg, Marion Co., Mo., died at Rock Island, Ill. Left husband & small children. (Correct spelling-Hofmeister).

Jul 9, 1879-John T. Jarboe, A. G. Lyell and others went fox hunting Saturday night. One reynard was started and caught near James' mill.

Oct 26, 1881-John Jarret's daughter, age 10 - north of railroad, died.

Dec 12, 1888-Miss Jordan died at residence of Lee Harrison near Oak Dale, last Friday.

Apr 1, 1885-Jareld L. Kerlin, born Henry county, Ky. in 1834, to Missouri in 1861, died. A brother John survives, buried in Greenwood cemetery. Military man.

May 21, 1879-The widow Marquette died Sunday evening at her home near Clinton. For eight years previous to death, she suffered from a disease that baffled medical skill.

Apr 5, 1876-Infant son of Mr. & Mrs. William G. Martin died of bronchitis, Saturday, Mar 18, 1876.

May 5, 1870-Andrew McBroom, died 29 Apr 1870, 86 th year of age, at residence of his son, P. G. McBroom. He was an early settler and a member of Methodist Church at Bacon Chapel. Cancer of the face.

Nov 10, 1870-Hattie A. Monteith, died 02 Nov 1870, 10 years, 1 month, 6 days old, daughter of John Monteith.

ghter of George J. & E. F. Parker.

Sep 6, 1876-Married on 03 Sep 1876 at residence of bride's par-
ents in Shelbina, Mo. by John J. Foster, Co. Ct. Justice, Hamp-
ton N. Parrish to Miss Sarah E. Bradley, daughter of William
Bradley, late of Camp Point, Ill.

Jul 26, 1876-Mrs. Rachel M., wife of M. C. Parrish died sudden-
ly near Bacon Chapel on Sunday, Jul 23, 1876. Deceased was a
kind, affectionate wife and mother. Leaves husband and 5 child-
ren.

Nov 10, 1870-George J. Parsons, died 07 Oct 1870, 9 years, 11
months, 17 days, s/o J. W. & M. E. Parsons.

Apr 4, 1877-Nellie Mead Parsons, daughter of M. B. & Carrie

of Alexandria, Va. To Mo with husband at an early day, raised
large family. Died in Shelby county.

May 23, 1888-Saunders, ALFRED, b. 07 May 1832 in Log Cabin
between Shelbyville and Oak Dale. Has a younger brother, Lewis
Saunders, never married. A broom maker.
(He went to Nebraska later).

Aug 20, 1879-Lakenan Items. James A. Saunders, living on the
Chandler farm, one-half mile west of this place, lost his infant
daughter on the 14th instant, with whooping cough.

Sep 3, 1879-Anna Floy Saunders, infant daughter of James A. &
Mary Saunders died, 13 Aug 1879.

Dec 3, 1879-Lucinda M. Settle, died 22 Nov 1879, 47 years.

_____, _____-Blanche Smith, youngest daughter of J. & M. Smith,
died, aged 1 year, 1 month, 12 days.

Feb 22, 1882-George Smith, son of late A. J. Smith, reported dead, at house of brother-in-law, Mr. Rager, just over line in Marion county, Mo., drowned himself in well. 25 years.

Nov 10, 1870-Mrs. Loreta Smith, died 06 Nov 1870, 71 years, at residence of M. A. Banter.

Mar 13, 1889-Robert Sparks died at home southeast of town, Thursday, age 50 years.

Jun 11, 1879-From Lentner-Sampson Stalcup started for Leadville about three weeks ago, has prospected out there, thinks it a hard place for an old man. He has gone to California to try his luck there.

Jan 18, 1882-Mrs. Henry Swearingen died the 16th of consumption at Walkersville.

21 Apr 1870-Minnie Taylor, daughter of Robert J. & Louise E. Taylor probably.

Nov 22, 1882-Elder Henson Thomas died last Saturday of 4 years illness of consumption, Baptist minister for forty years. His wife, age 80 years, died 3 months ago.

Jun 21, 1882-Mrs. Mary Thomas (Elder Thomas), early settler in Mo., died in Monroe county.

Feb 19, 1879-B. W. Thurman, Sr., died 16 Feb 1879, 72nd yrs of age, formerly from Louisville, Ky. Funeral 12 o'clock at the Shelbina Presbyterian Church on 19 Feb 1879.

Oct 16, 1889-Miss Fannie Timmons, insane to Fulton or St. Joseph. Brought to town by Uncle John Edwards.

Mar 13, 1889-Milby H. Timmons of Bacon Chapel area, died Feb 27, 45 years old.

Feb 1, 1882-Mrs. Rebecca Smith, wife of Jephtha Smith, southwest of Shelbina died Jan 19, 1882. Survived by 1 daughter, 4 step-children and her husband. Born Monroe county, 47 yrs old.

Jul 7, 1875-In Shelbina, Shelby county on June 23, 1875, Verli-nda C. Smith died, wife of G. W. Smith. In 60th year.

Oct 13, 1875-Manda Swearingen, 4, daughter of William & Belle Swearingen died.

Jul 30, 1879-Mrs. Tabitha Vaughn, daughter of Travis Million, near Woodlawn, died on Tuesday of last week, aged 25 years.

Chinn was in one of them, holding the lines, and Minter Veal in the other. We wish them prosperous sailing on fortunes sea, out west.

Mar 5 ,1879 -James L. West, former residence of Shelbyville and a Miss Jones of Hannibal were married in that city last week.

_____, ____-Mrs. J. D. White, daughter of Samuel Moxley, 36 years died.

Aug 28, 1889-Mrs. Wiggins died, mother of John & Henry, buried Wood cemetery, Walkersville. Died on Aug 24th.

_____, 1879-Married 16 _____ 1879, John D. Wilkins to Lillian Mary Thomas, at bride's father residence, by John J. Foster, J. of P., all of Shelby county.

Oct 26, 1887-Lewis Wilkins, old, died Thursday. (19 Oct 1887)

Jan 8, 1878-Charles Albert Wilkins, died 16 Dec 1877, only son of C. L. & Julia Wilkins, 3 years, 2 months, 8 days.

Jul 30, 1879-A colored woman named Winnie, died here last Saturday, buried Sunday. A large procession followed her remains to the grave.

May 9, 1888-Mrs. Bertie Wood, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles northwest of Shelbyville died the 2nd, buried ~~at~~ Fellows, daughter of S. P. Engles, married George Wood a year ago. (Lived southwest of Shelbyville).

_____, 1880-On Sunday, 28 Nov 1880, at the residence of the bride, by Rev. W. A. Tarwater, Mr. Robert Wood & Miss Alice Beath, all of Shelby county.

Feb 23, 1876-Mrs. Lucy Woodyard, died 16 Feb 1876, 29 years, 2 months, 2 days, in Shelbina.

Jul 31, 1889-John Worland's babe, 18 months old, died at the residence, Hager's Grove.

Aug 8, 1888-Sarah J. Worland, died 19 Jul 1888; born 30 May 1827 in Scott county, Ky., daughter of James Combs of Ky. In 1844 she came to Missouri on a visit to her sister. Became acquainted with Mr. Worland, married at her home in Ky., Jul 7, 1845, then to Monroe county, Mo. 8 children, 4 deceased. 4 married and settled.

Mar 5 , 1879-Dr. A. L. Yancey's mother, Mrs. Smith, Hunnewell, died 28 Feb 1879, buried graveyard near Hunnewell, 80 years, a few days. Member of Christian Church, services at grave by T. Penn.
