March 3, 1897, (Wednesday) issue.

Mary J. ROUSE, b. Rockbridge County, Virginia, April 4, 1833;
d. at dau's home $\frac{1}{4}$ miles east of Bacon Chapel,
22 Feb. 1897, 63 yrs, 9 mos, 18 da, nee King.
m. John Rouse when about 19 years old. Six
children, 5 survive. Husband d. 30 yrs ago,
leaving her with 5 helpless children, whom she
raised. Buried-Bacon Chapel.

March 17, 1897 (Wednesday) issue.

Mary E. WINSTON 'Grandma' d. at home of son William of lagrippe
near Duncan Chapel, last Wed, aged 86 yrs.
Buried-Bacon Chapel.

Jesse WINSTON son of William, d. of spinal meningitis last
Monday, age 21 yrs. Buried-Bacon Chapel yester-
day.

Clifford Earl CHANDLER, son of Mr. & Mrs. J. S. Chandler d. in
this city last Wednesday of abcess of lung, age
about 2 yr.

_____ PERRY Wife of William Perry died at her home near
Oak Dale, March 9, 1897 of pneumonia. Daugh-
ter of Postmaster Davis of Oak Dale. Baptist.
Leaves husband and 2 children, youngest 2 mos.
old.

Abraham WHITAKER d. March 14, 1897 of consumption, b. Trimble
Co., Ky., 47 yrs ago. To vicinity 1864.
Member of Christian Ch. Survived by widow
and 4 children. Buried-Our cemetery.

March 24, 1897 (Wednesday) issue.

Daniel TAYLOR b. February 6, 1821, to Shelby County in 1843,
in a year or two m. Amanda, dau of Dr. Anthony
Minter who lived on North River. Farmed, kept
tan yard and livestock. In 1862 moved to Shel-
bina, no children. (Picture)

March 31, 1897 (Wednesday) issue

Mrs. George T. HILL b. 1835 Ky., nee Armstrong. Member of
Christian church. One of 16 ch. To
Shelby Co 1856. Buried-our cemetery.
d. Thurs 1897. 4 children, 1 survives
Mrs. Coeper Bodine.

January 27, 1897 (Wednesday) issue.

Luella B. VANDIVER b. June 19, 1861; d. Jan 24, 1897, nee Barclay, m. some 13 or 14 yrs ago Dr. C. E. Vandiver. Services M.E. So. Church, by Rev. Warren. Laid to rest in cemetery. Mentions her boys does not name.

Monroe County, Missouri.

January 13, 1897 (Wednesday) issue.

James Thomas HART b. c75 yrs ago in Fayette Co., Ky. d. January 1897 in Monroe Co., Mo., on Wed. bu-Greenwood on Friday a.m. Settled in Monroe Co., Mo. 1844. 5 sons and 1 dau, widow who he married many years ago as Miss Doctor. Methodist.

Charlotte WARREN d. at home of son W. H. Warren, Shelbina, 17 Feb 1897, age 89 y, 9 da. Service at Crooked Creek. From Ky over 60 years ago.

March 3, 1897 (Wednesday) issue. Shelbyville Items.

B. B. BROUGHTON of Paris d. suddenly Feb 21, 1897, age 76. He was a man of strong convictions and lived up to them and was recognized as a good christian. He was a brother of "Coin" Broughton who lived near Oak Dale in this county (Shelby) for many years and a uncle of Frank, Joe and Jerome Broughton who still live near Oak Dale.

Marion County, Missouri.

February 17, 1897 (Wednesday) issue.

Rev. Joseph CHRISTIAN d. Feb 14, 1897 of consumption at home of parents. Buried-Andrew Chapel. Baptist minister. Parents lived 8 miles northeast of Monroe City. Survived by wife and 2 little children.
