He either slipped or fell on the large belt, which runs from a 10 h.p. mtr to a feed grinder, while it was in rapid motion, or else his jacket caught between the belt & the pulley.

Although ano pty was in the room at the time, he was looking elsewhere when the accident happened.

When found Mr. Martin was lying on the feed grinder, unconscious & his jacket was torn from him. The large belt had been thrown off the motor pulley & was wound up on the other pulley of the feed grinder.

Mr. Martin was still unconscious at our press, & the extent of his injuries is unknown.
