Shelbina has many excellent merchants and among those none rank higher than Messrs. Morgan & Gwynn who are wagon and carriage manufacturers and do general blacksmithing and repairing. These gentlemen are worthy of commendation for their enterprise.

Mr. Stephen Thomas is another reliable and excellent mechanic of Shelbina. He has a commodious shop and does general blacksmithing. He has been in Shelbina five years and is a most deserving young man.
