Highlights of History of Shelby County

(Information in regard to History of Shelby County and the State of Missouri has been obtained from History of Monroe and Shelby Counties 1884—St. Louis Historical Company)

FIRST SETTLEMENT—1831

Section 33, Twp. 57, Range 9—cabin on Black Creek—a little more than ½ mile from its mouth—Settler, man by name of Norton.

FIRST POST OFFICE—1834

Established at residence of William B. Broughton, and called Oak Dale, name it has borne ever since. Mails came in from Palmyra once a week.

THE YEAR 1835

Year 1835 remembered by settlers as “the cold year,”—uncommonly severe. May 12th a heavy frost and a severe freeze. Ground frozen to depth of two inches in some places. Everything liable to be affected by the frost, that was exposed, was killed. Buds well expanded on the bushes and shrubbery, and even the hickory and oak saplings and trees were killed.

CHOLERA IN PALMYRA—1835

Cholera in Palmyra brought new settlers to Shelby County. People camped along streams or near the springs until danger was over. No cases in Shelby County.

CROPS

Excellent during the early days.

Wheat, a certain crop—yield sometimes 50 bushels per acre.

Corn, oats, hemp—good crops.

INSECT PESTS

No insect pests disturbed the grain until after 1840.

PASTURES

Stock flourished well on prairies from early spring until June.

In June, settlers burned off a large tract of ground partially covered with dry grass, and cattle for miles around would congregate and feed on young and tender grass that sprang up. It was said “a late burn was better to keep the cattle together than a fence with stakes and riders.”

WEEDS

In early days there were no poke-weeds, Jamestown (jimson) weeds or pursley.

LATE DEVELOPED CROPS AND FRUITS

No clover, bluegrass or timothy were in this county, in early days. No fruit trees or locust trees were here, but nearly every immigrant brought a supply with him.

FIRST CELEBRATION

First celebration July 4, 1836 at spring on Clear Creek, 5 miles a little north of east of Shelbyville (Section 18-58-9) where Miller’s Mill was built—grand barbecue and free dinner given.

FIRST AGRICULTURAL FAIR—Fall of 1838—Shelbyville

William B. Lewis, Judge William Gooch, and Charles H. Smith each claimed to have gathered over 95 bushels of corn on an acre of ground.

FIRST SCHOOL TOWNSHIP ORGANIZED—Jan. 1838

Inhabitants of Congressional township 58, Range 11, by Mr. John Dunn, petitioned County Court to organize their township, under the name of Van Buren, and this was done.

LAST INDIANS SEEN IN SHELBY COUNTY—1839

Pottawatomies tribe camped not far from Hager’s Grove for a few days.

GAME AND WILD ANIMALS PLENTIFUL—Bear, panthers, wolves, deer.

NAMING THE STREAMS

Salt River—originally Auhaha, or Oahaha, but changed to Salt River for the salt springs near it, in Ralls County.

Black Creek—originally called Jake’s Creek from a settler who lived on its banks. Later called Black

Laid on flat side it takes 4½ brick to cover a square foot. Laid on edge it takes 9. When the size of the brick is 8½ by 4 by 2½ it takes about 17¼ to the cubic foot.

Wall Paper—Is sold by the roll which is 1½ ft. wide and 24 ft. long. Hence, there usually are 36 square feet or 4 square yards in a roll.

Roofs—To give ½ pitch take .6 of base for rafter's length; ¼ pitch .7.

HINTS TO HOUSEKEEPERS

Remove scratches: Scratches on dark furniture can be made almost invisible by the application of tincture of iodine. Wrap a small swab of cotton on the end of a toothpick, dip it in the iodine, and apply to the scratches. When the iodine is dry, polish with the regular furniture polish.

Pour boiling water over lemons before using. This will increase the amount of juice they will produce.

To prevent left-over paint from drying out, pour melted paraffin upon the surface.

When washing chamois or doeskin gloves, add a few drops of olive oil to the rinse water to keep them soft.

A tract of land, 1 mile square, containing 640 acres, is called a section. To find the number of acres in a tract of land. Rule: Divide the number of square rods by 160; or number of square chains by 10.
One side of a square tract or lot containing 1 acre is 208.7 feet.

CISTERNS. BOILERS (Round)

To find the capacity, in gallons. Rule: Multiply the square of the diameter by the depth, and the product by $5\frac{7}{8}$ for gallons: by .1865 for barrels. (All in ft.)

BARRELS, CASKS

To find contents, in gallons. Rule: Multiply the square of the mean diameter by the depth, and the product by .0034.

COAL

If the bin is square, multiply the length by the width and then multiply the product by the average depth of coal in it. This will give the number of cubic feet of coal in the bin. Hard coal averages 80 pounds per cubic foot or 25 cubic feet to a ton in a solid state. Chestnut sizes average 56 pounds to the cubic foot.

WOOD

A cord of wood is equivalent to a pile, closely stacked, 8 feet in length, 4 feet in breadth, and 4 feet in height. To check the number of cubic feet of wood in any pile of the shape of a rectangular solid measure the length, width, and height of the pile in feet and multiply these three dimensions together. The result is the number of cubic feet of wood in the pile. To reduce to cords, divide by 128.

CORN CRIBS

Corn in the ear of good quality, when settled, measures about $2\frac{1}{4}$ cubic feet to the bushel; inferior quality $2\frac{3}{4}$ to $2\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet.

To find the capacity in bushels of a crib, multiply the length by the width and height, in feet, and then divide by $2\frac{1}{4}$, $2\frac{3}{4}$, or $2\frac{1}{2}$ as the case may be.

HAY STACK (Round)

To find contents in cubic feet, multiply the square of the average distance around the stack by the average height. Multiply the product by .08; then divide by 350 if the hay is well settled; otherwise by 400 or 450. (OBLONG)—Multiply the average length by width and by height.

GRAIN OR BUSHEL MEASURE: In the United States, the standard bushel is 2,150.42 cubic inches. To measure the grain in a bin in terms of bushels, level the grain and multiply its length by its width by its height in inches. Divide that number by 2,150.42 and the result will be the amount of grain in bushels.

LUMBER MEASURE: In the lumber trade the unit of measurement is the "board-foot," which equals 1 square foot, 1 inch thick. To find the board-feet of a standard board multiply the length, in feet, by the width, in inches, and divide the result by 12. To the board-feet in planks or square timbers, multiply the length in feet, by the width and then the thickness in inches and divide by 12.

HIGHLIGHTS OF HISTORY OF SHELBY COUNTY

Creek because of dark color of water when they first saw it.
North River—originally called North Two-Rivers, and South River, in Marion County was South Two-Rivers. Two streams unite half a mile from the Mississippi, into which they flow in the eastern part of Marion.

Tiger Fork—1835—John Winnegan, lived near where the road from Bethel to Newark crosses Tiger Fork, killed two panthers of enormous size near his house. The neighbors called them tigers, and named the stream on which they were killed the Tiger Fork of North River.

FIRST MARRIAGE IN SHELBY COUNTY—April 30, 1835

Bradford Hunsucker and Miss Dicy Stice, at residence of Peter Stice, father of the bride—place, near the present town site of Bethel.

CLOTHING

Flax and wool furnished material for home spun clothing. Women wore linsey, cotton, and buckskin. Men wore buckskin, jeans, cotton, and linsey.

CHURCHES AND SCHOOLS

In 1837 not a church or a school was in the County. Methodists held camp meeting 1837 at a spring (NW 32-58-9) about a mile north of Oak Dale.

FIRST SESSION OF COUNTY COURT—April 9, 1835

At residence of Wm. B. Broughton—Justices James Foley, Thomas H. Clements, and Adolphus E. Wood. Place of residence, Oak Dale (section 5-57-9) in what is now Jackson township.

THE FIRST COURTHOUSE—Dec. 1838. Cost \$4045.

County and Circuit Courts were held at house of W. B. Broughton, at Oak Dale, until July 1836, when the first term was held at Abraham Vandiver's in Shelbyville. This house was called "the court-house," until the completion of the real building in December 1838.

FIRST TERM OF CIRCUIT COURT

First term of Circuit Court of Shelby County convened November 26, 1835 at house of W. B. Broughton, at Oak Dale.

THE FIRST ELECTION—Aug. 1835—Two townships and two voting places.

Black Creek Twp.—Voting place, house of Wm. B. Broughton.

North River Twp.—Voting place, house of Alexander Buford.

Total votes cast—85 out of 100 voters in county, not more.

FIRST MILL—1836—Peter Stice—On North River, present site of town of Bethel. Another mill, Silas and Asa Boyce on Salt River, 3½ SE Shelbyville NW 10-57-10. Later became well known institution of county for many years.

FIRST BRIDGE—1839—Across Black Creek, west of Shelbyville.

FIRST JAIL—1846—North of Court House on north side of the square.

FIRST NEWSPAPER, SHELBYVILLE, 1853—Shelbyville Spectator. Editor. F. M. Daulton. Location, office on north side of public square near north-west corner Building burned 1854.

FIRST RAILROAD—1859—Completed Hannibal & St. Joseph.

SLAVERY IN THE COUNTY

In 1860, 724 slaves in Shelby County—largest number ever in the county at one time.

ROBBERY OF COUNTY TREASURY BY BURGLARS, 1868—\$10,000.

From vault in County Clerk's office.

SHELBYVILLE COUNTY SEAT

Laid out by the County Seat Commissioners, in the fall of 1835. (Prior to that time Lewis H. Gilaspy lived a little southeast of the town site, his land forming a part of the town. He was the first settler near the site.)

In December, 1835, the plat of the seat of Justice as prepared by T. J. Bounds, was adopted by County Court and the town called Shelbyville. T. J. Bounds was appointed County Seat Commissioner and ordered to lay out town into lots and blocks as soon as convenient.

MUNICIPAL TOWNSHIP OF SHELBY COUNTY—bounds fixed by County Court, May 10, 1868.

BETHEL LAID OUT AND ESTABLISHED—1845—Germans from Pa. and Ohio. (Also purchased farms west of Shelbyville)

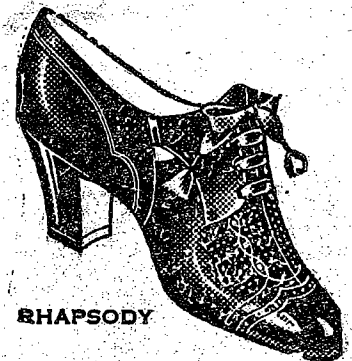
